## 2025 WOOD COUNTY FAIR FLOWER SHOW RULES

1. Each show will be judged by accredited OAGC judges according to the OAGC standards system.
2. The decision of the judges will be final.
3. Any exhibitor, over 17 years old, to compete for class premiums, must have a membership or exhibitor ticket. Exhibitors under 17 may enter under a parent's membership or purchase a youth exhibitor's ticket.
4. All classes open to those who grow flowers and plants for pleasure only, not for the purpose of livelihood.
5. The exhibitor must grow all horticulture entries. Correct variety name(s) should be on the entry tag.
6. Plant material used in artistic designs must be listed on a separate 3" x 5" card displayed with the entry.
7. Plant material may be obtained from any source for use in arrangements.
8. No artificial plant material will be permitted.
9. Fresh plant material may not be artificially colored, painted, treated or dyed.
10. Fresh plant material must be predominating in all traditional designs.
11. Plant materials on the conservation list may not be used unless grown by the exhibitor, which must be stated on the card accompanying the design.
12. Foliage is permitted unless otherwise stated.
13. Dried plant material may be natural, colored or painted.
14. When the horticulture schedule calls for a definite number, a greater or lesser number disqualifies.
15. In Division A, the plant must have been in the exhibitor's possession at least three (3) months.
16. Houseplants entered in the first show may be entered in the second show under a different class. .
17. A person may enter only one exhibit under each artistic class.
18. In the horticulture section more than one entry will be permitted for each different named variety. Variety name must be included on entry tag. Premiums will not be paid for more than two exhibits per class.
19. No scenes or landscapes will be accepted.
20. Entries must not be moved or position altered without assistance of the Placement Committee.
21. Exhibitors must replace plant material for all designs as needed to assure freshness of the design for the duration of the show. Do not change the design.
22. No advanced designers permitted in classes 111 and 112. Designers who have won 1<sup>st</sup> place on more than two invitationals in the previous two years, floral judges, recent John Moore Award recipients are considered advanced designers.
23. No exhibitors permitted in the show area during judging.
24. Containers, bases, and accessories should be marked on the bottom, with exhibitor's name, and info.
25. While the Flower Show Committee will afford the best possible care and protection to all exhibits, it distinctly disclaims any liability for losses or damage to exhibits or personal property of the exhibitors.
26. Any entry removed before the guidelines set forth above will forfeit all monetary premium(s) won by the exhibitor in both the first and second shows.
27. BEST OF SHOW AWARDS (rosettes) will be given in both the First and Second Shows for:
  - Rose specimen classes 1 – 28
  - Horticulture specimens 29-99
  - Horticultural plants 100 -110,
  - Adult artistic 111-124
  - Junior horticulture 125-133, and
  - Junior artistic 134-139.

## TO ENTER

All exhibitors must have purchased a Wood County Fair membership or week pass at the time of registration, except children under 18 who may enter on a parent's membership or with a youth exhibitor pass.

Exhibitors are limited to 2 entries per category in all horticulture classes and 1 entry per category in all artistic classes.

WOOD COUNTY FAIR – OPEN CLASS ENTRY SHEETS and EXHIBITOR PASSES are available in advance at the Wood County Fair Office. The computer printed tags that have not been picked up will be available in the flower show staging area during set up before the shows. **No entry sheets will be accepted after two days before the shows.**

## AWARDS

JOHN MOORE CREATIVE DESIGN AWARD will be given in both the First and Second Shows for an outstanding or unique creative design. It will not necessarily be chosen from the blue-ribbon winners. An acknowledgement card will be placed by the design and the winner's name will be put on a plaque.

### THE FRIEDA SANDER PERPETUAL MEMORIAL AWARD

The Frieda Sander Perpetual Memorial Award will be presented to the exhibitor having accumulated the most points in the artistic division from both shows along with a monetary award of \$25.00. The award may be held for not more than two (2) consecutive years, after which the winner will be eligible to receive the award again. A plaque with the past winners will be on display.

### GARDEN CLUB AWARD

The Garden Club Award will be presented to the garden club whose members accumulated the greatest number of points from both shows along with a monetary award of \$25.00. Points will be awarded in both horticulture and artistic divisions: 1st = 5 points, 2nd = 3 points, 3rd = 1 point.

### JANE BURNS HORTICULTURE MEMORIAL AWARD

The Wood County Garden Clubs will present the Jane Burns Horticulture Award with \$ 25.00 to the exhibitor accumulating the MOST FIRST PLACE BLUE RIBBONS in Horticulture Division, Classes 1 through 110 from both shows.

### JANE BURNS-JUNIOR HORTICULTURE AWARD

A \$20.00 check will be presented to the junior exhibitor with the most horticulture points from both shows.

### THE FRIEDA SANDER JUNIOR AWARD

A \$20.00 check will be presented to the junior exhibitor having accumulated the most points in the Junior Artistic Division from both shows. Also, their name will be placed on a plaque that will be on display at the flower show during every fair. The award may be held for no more than two (2) years consecutively, after which the winner will be eligible to receive the award again.

Points for both awards are scored as follows: 1st = 5 points, 2nd = 3 points, 3rd = 1 point
